Beginner events as per rules outlined below

Beginners**	16 counts of flinging, 2 step Highland Fling, 4 step Highland Fling, Pas de Basque and closed spring points 32 counts, 2 step Irish Jig
Under 7 years	Highland Fling, Irish Jig (Ghillie Callum Award)
Under 8 years	Highland Fling, Sword Dance, Irish Jig
Under 9 years	Highland Fling, Sword Dance (Ghillie Callum Award)
Under 10 years	Highland Fling, Sword Dance, Irish Jig, Sailors Hornpipe
Under 11 years	Irish Jig, Sailors Hornpipe (Ghillie Callum Award)
Under 12 years	Highland Fling, Seann Triubhas, Highland Reel*, Irish Jig, Irish Hornpipe
Under 14 years	Sword Dance, Irish Jig (Ghillie Callum Award), Highland Reel*, Reel O'Tulloch*, Sailors Hornpipe
Open	Highland Fling, Sword Dance (Ghillie Callum Award), Reel O'Tulloch*, Irish Jig Single Time, Irish Jig Double Time
Any Age	Irish Lilt (4 steps), Double Sword Dance – 3&1, Waltz Clog (Note these events are not conducted under the rules of the PDANZ)

*Under 12 yrs Highland Reel - In event of insufficient entries, the alternative dance will be a Sword Dance

*Under 14 yrs Highland Reel - In event of insufficient entries, the alternative dance will be a Seann Triubhas

*Under 14 yrs Reel O'Tulloch - In event of insufficient entries, the alternative dance will be a Highland Fling

*Open Reel O'Tulloch - In the event of insufficient entries, the alternative dance will be a Seann Triubhas

** Beginner classes:

Dancers eligible are those not P & D registered, or those not entered in the programmed jig/sword dance classes

No beginner class is danced under P & D rules. Can be completed in highland dress or studio uniform

- 1) 16 count flinging will commence with a 16 count introduction, 16 counts of basic flinging with no turn. Arms optional
- 2) 2 step highland fling will commence with a 16 count introduction, 1st step of highland fling and 1 step of dancers own choice. Arms optional
- 3) 4 step beginners fling will commence with a 16 count introduction. 1st and 4th step as per highland fling. Steps 2 & 3 dancers own choice. Arms preferable but not compulsory.
- 4) Pas de basque and closed spring points. Bow to commence. 6 pas de basque movements then 4 closed spring points, repeated twice. Arms optional.
- 5) 2 step jig. 16 count introduction. 1st step circle heel clicking with break and 1 step of dancers own choice. Can be completed in pumps.
