Trophy Notes

All trophies remain the property of Otago Centre. Trophies are held by the winners for one year only, or such time as the Centre may prescribe and must be returned whenever requested in good condition. Competitors will be held liable for the cost of any repairs required.

2021 Trophy Holders: If not returned already, trophies must be in the Secretary's hands by Saturday 4th June 2022. If posting, please pack trophies adequately.

PIPING CONDITIONS

- 1. All events will be conducted under the rules of the Piping and Dancing Association of N.Z. (Inc.)
- 2. All competitors compete at their own risk.
- 3. Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by all fees. This will be strictly adhered to.
- 4. All competitors must be registered for the year 1st July 2021 to 30th June 2022. Registration fee \$30 for under 18 years, \$50 for 18 years and over.
- 5. All competitors under 21 years of age must produce birth certificate when called upon to do so.
- 6. Prizes in events (except championships where a minimum of five competitors are required)

3 entries: 1 prize 5 entries: 2 prizes 7 entries: 3 prizes 15 entries: 4 prizes 25 entries: 5 prizes

- 7. No New Zealand or South Island championship will be awarded unless the judge certifies the winning performance is of sufficient standard to merit the award.
- 8. In the event of a tie for a most points trophy, Rule 13.1 of the bylaws will apply.
- 9. Any person found damaging venue property will be liable for full restitution.
- 10. Local competitors must reside within 30km radius of the Octagon.

- 11. Competitors in the PIPING SECTION please note:
 - 11.1. Piping Judges shall award marks to all competitors in all events.
 - 11.2. Competitors in B Grade competitions and above shall tune their own pipes whilst on the competition platform without any outside assistance for tuning.
 - 11.3. PIPERS DRESS: By-laws will be adhered to
 - 11.4. Pipers may enter in their own grade and one grade above for both Piobaireachd and Light Music..
 - 11.5. Entry to the Dunedin Silver Medal event is restricted to all pipers who are B Grade or lower
 - 11.6. In all Piobaireachd events, pipers shall make available to the judge a legible copy of the music to be played if the setting is different to that contained in the Piobaireachd Society Collection or Kilberry Book or is not contained within either of these publications.
 - 11.7. Tunes played in Light Music events in all grades shall be a minimum of 4 parts, unless otherwise specified.
 - 11.8. Tunes for Open, B, and U21 grades and special events shall be submitted prior; selection will be advised to pipers either on entering the Final Tuning Room, or on entering the Hall. Please refer to the Pipers Tune Submission form.
 - 11.9. B Grade and Under 21 Events The judge shall nominate the tune/tunes to be played. Two tunes of each time signature to be submitted EXCEPT that three tunes are to be submitted for the Dunedin Silver Medal Piobaireachd.
- 11.10. Under 21 Events qualify for the William Boyle Foundation Award. Conditions available from the foundation or at the competitions.
- 11.11. Open events The judge shall nominate the tune/tunes to be played. Three tunes of each time signature to be submitted for all events. Two tunes will be played in the Open Grade 2/4 March.
- 11.12. Novice Event For pipers who have not won a 1st prize in any event other than chanter events.

GENERAL CONTROLS THAT APPLY AT ALL LEVELS FOR COMPETITIONS	ADDITIONAL CONTROLS SPECIFIC TO EACH LEVEL	LEVEL
 Any person who is unwell should not attend the competition. Hygiene: Competition organisers should have a box of disposable masks available as required. Hand Sanitiser is to be available throughout the venue. (If outdoors competition, ensure Hand Sanitiser is available at the Secretary's Table and beside Dance / Piping / Drumming Platforms.) Ensure washroom facilities have liquid soap and disposable paper towels. Suitable rubbish receptacles must be provided. Ventilation: (at indoor venues) All doors or windows that can be opened should be opened to ensure good ventilation where no air conditioning system available. 	Outdoor Events: - No number limitations. Indoor Events: - Maximum number of attendees is up to 200 (this does not include workers) (NB. Workers include anyone required to operate the business or service, and therefore includes paid and unpaid.) Note: The size of the venue, combined with physical distancing requirements, may mean that less than 200 max. can be in attendance. The Host committee may also decide to further restrict the maximum in attendance, taking into account any other safety requirements. Masks must be worn by all attendees aged 8 yrs (or Year 4) and over unless a valid mask exemption is supplied. (Masks only to be removed by competitors prior to performance on stage) Competition organisers should have a box of disposable masks available as required. Organisers will either pre draw events or have the board steward draw for all competitors. Swords to be placed and handled only by the board stewards on the day. Im Physical Distancing Requirements to be applied in venue: This includes Ensuring a minimum of 1 metre distance between each family group in changing rooms. I metre spacing should be maintained between competitors lined up waiting to compete and between prize winners during presentations. Reports for Dancing Competitions: With the exception of Island and New Championship classes, no judges' reports at the Red Traffic Light setting. For Island and NZ Championship events both the Judge and the writer must wear a mask. Kitchen: No food sales should be conducted. Food preparation for Judges and officials must be conducted with increased hygiene measures in place — gloves to be worn and tongs used etc.
